What is Food Fraud (FF)? Food Fraud is the deliberate and intentional substitution, addition, tampering, or misrepresentation of food, food ingredients, or food packaging; or false or misleading statements made about a product, for economic gain.

Answer these 10 Questions to conduct a DIY Readiness audit:

1. Have you conducted a Food Fraud Vulnerability Assessment?
2. Is the assessment written?
3. Have you created a Food Fraud Prevention Strategy?
4. Is the strategy in writing?
5. Can the implementation of the strategy be demonstrated?
6. Does the strategy have executive level sign-off?
7. Do you conduct an annual Food Fraud Incident Review?
8. What methods do you use to review incidents, both yours and general market?
9. Does your strategy address ALL types of food fraud?
10. Does your strategy consider incoming goods (e.g. ingredients) and outgoing goods (e.g. finished products)?
